Security Progressive Wage Model (PWM) Requirements

Licensed Security Officers will need to comply with the training requirements and job functions of the corresponding grades of Security Officers under the security PWM. More information on PWM can be found here.

The job functions for each PWM grade can be found in Annex D of the <u>2018 STC</u> recommendations accepted by the Government on 16 November 2018.

#With effect on 1 January 2020, all licenced SOs will be required to obtain a third BLU which is RTT. Licensed SO who has not obtained the WSQ certification in RTT shall not work as a SO anywhere except at warehouses¹ or condominiums² unless otherwise exempted by the Licensing Officer. SOs already trained in 'Handle Counter Terrorism Activities', are exempted from RTT. RTT training providers can be found here.

¹A warehouse is a building where storage is the principal use and where no business is transacted other than incidentally to such storage (URA Class 10)

²A Condominium refers to 'strata-titled properties (non-landed) that are solely for residential use' which include condominiums, executive condominiums, privatised HUDCs, apartments and residential cluster housing regulated under the Land Titles (Strata) Act, Chapter 158

Security Screening Requirements

The following WSQ certifications are required before you can perform the respective functions:

Recognise Terrorist Threats (RTT)

All security officers must obtain two Workforce Skills Qualification (WSQ) basic licensing units. [1] From 1 Jan 2020, security officers will be required to obtain a third basic licensing unit, known as "Recognise Terrorist Threats" (RTT). RTT is a two-day WSQ course which will train security officers on awareness of terrorist threats, as well as observation skills to recognise person-borne, vehicle-borne, and object-based threats.

The requirement is to complete RTT training by 1 Jan 2020 which about 80% of all active security officers today will achieve it. [2] Those who do not complete RTT training by 1 Jan 2020 will still be able to retain their licences, but can only be deployed at warehouses and condominiums until they complete their RTT training. SPF will consider subsequently extending the RTT training requirement to all security officers.

SOs already trained in 'Handle Counter Terrorism Activities' (HCTA), are exempted from RTT. SOs who are not trained in RTT or HCTA can only be deployed at condominiums and warehouses come 1 Jan 2020.
