## **Licensing Conditions for Ad-hoc PE Licence**

- The licensee must not, without reasonable excuse, be absent from the event.
- 2. The licensee must deploy sufficient marshals for security and crowd control.
- 3. The licensee must ensure that sound amplification is toned down to a level where it would not cause annoyance to the general public. If such annoyance is caused, the Police may direct the licensee to have the volume reduced and the licensee is required to comply with this direction. Unless otherwise stipulated by the Licensing Officer, only two audio speakers must be used and they must be inclined downwards to face the audience.
- 4. The licensee must ensure that no public entertainment is provided in the licensed premises beyond the hours stipulated in the licence or, where the licensed hours have been varied, beyond such hours as may be notified to the licensee by the Licensing Officer.
- 5. The licensee must obtain approval from relevant authority/management for the use of the premise.
- 6. The licensee must ensure that no violent, lewd or obscene act, song, remark, message, display or exhibit shall be made in the performances. He must also ensure that the performers are not indecently attired.
- 7. The licensee must ensure that the public entertainment is not likely to be offensive to any race or religion.
- The licensee must ensure that the performances shall be carried out in a designated area or performance area and does not create any obstruction to the passage of any member of the public or any vehicle or vessel.
- The licensee must ensure that the event is conducted in a socially responsible manner and does not cause any danger or undue obstruction or alarm to the general public.
- 10. The licensee must take reasonable measures to ensure the safety of the performers and the members of the public.
- 11. The licensee must ensure that adequate first aid is readily available.
