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C. Can I amend the MER that I have submitted?

D. How to Submit the MER Without Corppass Access

For clinics that do not have Corppass, MedP can apply to whitelist their Singpass through Traffic Police to conduct medical examination for Driving/ Vocational licence holders.

1. Please submit the request to spf_tp_medical@spf.gov.sg to whitelist your MedP Singpass Account.
2. This process will take about 14 working days.
3. Once your Singpass account is whitelisted, you can submit the medical examination report via MedP's Singpass using this [MER](#).

E. What happens after the MER is successfully submitted?

Once the MER has been successfully submitted, the Traffic Police and Land Transport Authority (LTA) will process it within 14 working days. You will be notified of the outcome once your Medical Examination Report (MER) has been processed.
