# PUBLIC ORDER (ELECTION MEETINGS AND PROCESSIONS IN PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS) REGULATIONS 2009

## PERMIT TO USE PERAMBULATING VEHICLE FOR BROADCAST OF ELECTION MESSAGES UNDER SECTION 7(1)(a) OF THE PUBLIC ORDER ACT 2009

and this is subjected to the following conditions:				

- 1. Only the vehicle(s) specified in the permit may be used for the election procession.
- 2. The person(s) tasked with driving / operating / using the vehicle shall not be a person prohibited from taking part in any election activity under section 83(1) of the Parliamentary Elections Act 1954.
- 3. The person(s) tasked with driving / operating / using the vehicle shall be in possession of a written authorisation to conduct election activities, in the prescribed form signed by a candidate or any election agent of the candidate and issued on or after Nomination Day (Form 22 or Form 23, under the First Schedule of the Parliamentary Elections Act 1954).
- 4. The permit holder shall ensure that the election procession is held only between 7.00 a.m. and 10.00 p.m.
- 5. The vehicle(s) shall be kept moving, unless the person(s) tasked with driving / operating / using the vehicle is complying with traffic signals; or complying with direction(s) of authorised officers / traffic marshals; or undertaking manoeuvres for safety of himself, herself, or for other road users.
- 6. All vehicles are required to comply with the registration and technical requirements set out in the Road Traffic Act 1961 and its relevant subsidiary legislation. The construction of the vehicle(s) or the construction or nature of the advertisement carried shall not:
  - (a) Cause danger, obstruction or annoyance to persons using the roads.
  - (b) Obstruct the sight of the driver either to the front or to the sides.
  - (c) Interfere with the ability of the driver to give the signals required by Road Traffic Rules.
  - (d) Render such signals wholly or partially invisible to the persons using the roads.
- 7. There shall not be any live broadcast made during the use of the perambulating vehicle(s).
- 8. The vehicle(s) must not come within 100 metres of an election meeting venue in respect of which a Police permit has been granted, from one hour before the scheduled start time in the permit to one hour after the scheduled end time in the permit.
- 9. There shall not be any carriage of persons at the back of open-deck vehicle(s) during the campaigning period.

## OFFICIAL (OPEN) / NON-SENSITIVE

- 10. All participants in the election procession must not, during the election procession, do any of the following:
  - (a) Use a loudspeaker or public address system to give a speech; and/or
  - (b) Sing or play any gong, drum, musical instrument or music-producing equipment.
- 11. The vehicle(s) shall not travel into any prohibited areas listed under the Public Order (Prohibited Areas) Order 2009 (see **Annex A**).

#### Advisory

The broadcasting of recorded messages should not be so loud as to cause annoyance to members of the public.

## Public Order (Prohibited Areas) Order 2009, which states:

No person shall hold any public assembly or public procession (other than a public assembly or public procession specified in paragraph 3) in –

- (a) Any public road, public place or place of public resort within any area described in the Schedule; or
- (b) Any public road forming the boundary of that area.

Note: Please take note of the Schedule (of three parts) which is attached together with this permit.


## **ANNEX A**

## THE SCHEDULE

#### PART I

## **PART ISTANA**


All that land within the boundaries commencing from the junction of Orchard Road and Buyong Road, in the direction leading to Cavenagh Road, thence along Buyong Road into the slip road to Cavenagh Road, along Cavenagh Road up to the perimeter fencing between Istana and the Bukit Timah Water Works, thence along the perimeter fencing up to Mackenzie Road leading into Sophia Road, thence along Sophia Road to the perimeter fencing between Istana and No. 107A, Sophia Road, thence along the entire stretch of Istana's perimeter fencing leading up to Plaza Singapura, thence along an imaginary line to Orchard Road, thence along the slip road leading into Penang Lane to the junction of Penang Road, thence along Penang Road to Buyong Road to the point of commencement, and which is more particularly delineated in the Plan below.



## **PART II**

## PARLIAMENT AND SUPREME COURT

All the land and waters within the boundaries commencing from a point at the junction of North Bridge Road with Coleman Street, thence along Coleman Street to its junction with St. Andrew's Road, thence along St. Andrew's Road to its junction with Stamford Road, thence along Stamford Road to its junction with Connaught Drive, thence along Connaught Drive to its junction with Old Parliament Lane, thence along Old Parliament Lane to the east bank of the Singapore River, proceeding along the east bank to the junction of North Bridge Road, thence along North Bridge Road to the point of commencement at the junction of North Bridge Road with Coleman Street, and which is more particularly delineated in the Plan below.



## **PART III**

## **STATE COURTS**

All that land within the boundaries commencing from a point from Block 32 New Market Road along Upper Cross Street, thence along Upper Cross Street into the slip road to Havelock Road, along Havelock Road to the junction of New Market Road, turning right into New Market Road and thence along an imaginary line to the point of commencement across Havelock Square, and which is more particularly delineated in the Plan below.
